Dear Sir or Madam,

We are contacting you in the hope you are interested in helping the volunteer committee comprising Veterans Square Foundation to complete its five year endeavor by building Veterans Square Monument in Lower Makefield Township. Our bid documents should be ready by early April, and we want to determine your interest in bidding on our project. We hope to award the contract in early to mid-May, and begin construction in early June, with the work completed by roughly the end of July. The monument is designed to honor veterans of the past, present and future within a community park setting. It is primarily a masonry project.

A design team comprised of local residents created the monument design. It consists of a graceful curved, sloping brick wall featuring various bronze plaques honoring local veterans of Yardley and Lower Makefield and a civic wall with patriotic quotes surrounding an existing flagpole. The monument will be graced by a life-size bronze eagle, designed by a local sculptor, representing the human spirit being uplifted as we look toward the future. There are engraved granite and brick "Freedom" pavers we have sold as part of our Stepping Stone Campaign that will be incorporated into the monument.

We are seeking a mason or contractor who would like to work with a volunteer veterans organization in terms of pricing of labor and materials. We are a 501(c)3 nonprofit, so your donation would be tax deductible to the extent allowable by law. For instance, if your bid was discounted by 25%, that difference would be tax deductible. We would also like to acknowledge our builder in our monument on a bronze dedication plaque that says "Veterans Square Monument – Built by XWZ Contractor."

Veterans Square Monument will be built in Veterans Square Park on the corner of Edgewood and Heacock Roads in Lower Makefield, near McCaffreys' and Woodside Presbyterian. Its location is perfect for the community to gather for special events like the Veterans Parade and Farmers Market, or for people to come on their own. We also want to educate our children about the sacrifices made by those who serve.

If interested, we will email you the bid, and an email document must be submitted to our committee. We need your name, mailing and email address, and telephone number.
